It's official; DD-214's are NOW On-line. The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) has provided the following web site for veterans to gain access to their DD-214's on-line:

This may be particularly helpful when a veteran needs a copy of his DD-214 for employment purposes. NPRC is working to make it easier for veterans with computers and Internet access to obtain copies of documents from their military files.





"Sgt James Salerno Sr."

Uncommon valor in one of the bloodiest campaigns in Marine Corps history. It was the defining thirty-six days of honor, courage and commitment. It was the taking of Iwo Jima. In fact, from February 19th to March 19th 1945 Sgt. James Salerno Sr. fought on those beaches just below Mt. Suribachi. Shoulder to shoulder with his Marine brothers he engaged the enemy most likely to the point of exhaustion never giving in! After all, he was a Carlson's Raider, "ethically indoctrinated," spending thirty one month's overseas. He participated in battles at Guadalcanal, the Solomon Islands, to Bougainville. On February 24th, 2016 Sgt. James Salerno Sr. will be ninety eight years young. He is one of the "greatest generation." A true hero of Iwo Jima.

On January 12th 2016 upon entering the home in Cedar Knolls you knew immediately it was a Marine Corps dwelling. Everywhere the eye would gaze, looked upon the accomplishments of a greatly decorated Marine. Angela, his wife, welcomed me lovingly and introduced me to Jim who smiled as we gathered around the kitchen table. We were joined by all three of his sons, Mike, Jim and Greg. We reviewed the impressive album displaying his citations, commendations and photographs of his time as a raider. It appeared to reignite the memories of those days for Jim with the assistance of his family. Yet truth be told, who would care to recall those



gruesome events on that volcanic island. To bear witness to your battalion and company buddies being blow apart by shells as they stood beside you. The horror of watching your platoon leader being killed and having the resilience to assume command. Sgt. Salerno did, and for nineteen days he led the attack rallying the remaining men to continue the offensive against the Japanese. Despite his company sustaining heavy casualties, his coolness and bravery assisted in attaining their objective.

Jim vividly recalled seeing the first flag raised up on February 23rd, 1945 a day before his birthday. He was right at the base of the mountain in the thick of the battle. It perhaps gave him the strength and the gung-ho" needed to carry out his gallant encounter awaiting him six days later. Jim stated, "We were" fighting right below Suribachi when the guy next to me said look, look up, our flag! I was so happy to see it. Later the admiral wanted it when they replaced it with the larger one but we wouldn't let him have it!" On March 19th, 1945 Sqt. Salerno was shot through the arm and received a Purple Heart along with the Silver Star Medal for his heroism. He was honorably discharged on November 19th 1946. After World War II he became a carpenter and married Angela Stavole. They have three sons and five grandchildren, Although none have served in the military they all agreed they grew up "Marine." Mike stated " Dad instilled in us the Marine Corps values and we appreciated what it meant to be Marine because of him." Jim chimed in and said," We were afraid not to be good!" It was overwhelmingly apparent the loving respect and Marine pride that runs deep within the family and rightfully so. No matter the Marine there always is a sense of kindred spirit amongst them. It sets them apart from the rest. They have earned that right in the battle scars they quietly, yet so proudly carry upon their shoulders each and every day. As his son Mike so perfectly explained, "I always say when the man upstairs made him he really broke the mold!" And his words ring true, for heroes such as Sqt. James Salerno are a special class of Marine, the kind other Marines aspire to

> SERGEANT JAMES A. SALERNO, UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS,

for service as set forth in the following

CITATION:

"For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity while serving as an Acting Platoon Leader of Company G, Third Battalion, Twenty-sixth Marines, Fifth Marine Division, in action against enemy Japanese forces on Iwo Jima, Volcano Islands, from 1 to 19 March 1945. Assuming command after his Platoon Leader was killed during a bestile his Platoon Leader was killed during a hostile night attack on 1 March, Sergeant Salerno immediately rallied his men to repulse the enemy and, on the following day, courageously led his platoon in an attack on a strong hostile position composed of many machine gun emplacements cut in-to solid rock. Although his group suffered severe casualties, Sergeant Salerno ably directed them in attaining their objective for the day and in holding it during the night against repeated enemy counterattacks. By his coolness, initiative and personal bravery, he upheld the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service.
