"Wreaths Across America"

December 12, 2015

It was not your usual Saturday in December. The weather was unseasonably warm and undoubtedly most families had Christmas gifts on their list of chores for the day. Yet in the reverent cemeteries of the First Presbyterian Church and United Methodist Church they had paying homage to veterans on their minds. This second annual event was held by the Ferro Monte Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The area coordinator was Kim Armstrong, an associate member of our detachment and the 1st Vice Regent of the Ferro Monte Chapter. The day's proceedings not only honored those service members who have gone before us but educated our youth on the meaning of respect for our military.

This year, at 11:00am, veteran families were given time to quietly lay wreaths upon their loved ones grave. Promptly at 11:15am with maps and section number in hands, volunteers representing a cross section of Americana participated in placing the remaining wreaths on the headstones of service members dating back to the American Revolution. During this time, names of fallen heroes were randomly heard in the morning mist as if in military final roll call fashion. Yet it was unknowingly done in attempts to locate placement for their honored wreath. One could almost see each soldier, marine, airmen, minuteman, or union "federals" standing at attention awaiting in patriotic tribute. Next, at exactly 12:00pm everyone was led to the Memorial Ceremony in the First Presbyterian Church, as others nationwide commenced as well. Highlights of the program included presentation of colors by the Morris County Police, the ceremonial arrangement of armed forces wreaths and keynote speeches by Lt Colonel Ingrid Parker, Garrison Commander Picatinny Arsenal, Congressman Leonard Lance and L/Cpl Robert J Slattery Commandant Robert Beck. At the conclusion of the service the audience followed the wreath presenters through the Corridor of Honor to Main Street where the wreaths will be on display for the holiday season. Afterwards, a reception in Fellowship Hall was enjoyed by all who attended.

In closing the day's events can best be described in the words of those who gave of their time to share in the experience. Lt Colonel Ingrid Parker, Garrison Commander stated, " I found it to be extremely reverent in honoring our fallen service members. I appreciate the privilege to represent Picatinny Arsenal. US Army Vietnam Veteran Andy Nero said," I felt proud to place wreaths and walk amongst my brothers. I was a field radio repairman, no shooting but I did my job. I was drafted and did what I had to. My father Patrick served in WWII as a artillery battery cook and my mom's 2 brothers in Korea. Plus, I didn't know anybody in Canada!" Also, retired US Army Lt Colonel Michael Milde who assisted in locating gravesites informed me that his son, Sean was fourth generation Army currently serving in Iraq and just promoted to the rank of Captain. And the day was epitomized in the opening remarks of Commandant Beck when he so eloquently stated, " Today we show a united front of national unity all across the United States of America as we Remember the fallen, Honor those who serve, and Teach our children the value of freedom!"
