This Month in USMC History

NOVEMBER

• **1 November 1983:** 300 Marines of the 22d Marine Amphibious Unit staged an amphibious and helicopter landing on the island of Carriacou, 15 miles northeast of Grenada, in a search for Cuban military installations or personnel. 17 Grenadian soldiers were captured, and arms, ammunition, and training sites were found. The next day the 22d MAU left the Caribbean area and proceeded to Beirut, Lebanon to replace the 24th MAU.

• 8 November 1990: President Bush announced that he planned to add more than 200,000 U.S. troops to those already deployed in Operation Desert Shield in the Persian Gulf area. The number of Marines in the area would be doubled by the addition of II MEF units from the Corps' east coast bases, and the 5th MEB from California. Within the next two months, Marine strength in the objective area would increase to nearly 90,000 Marines.

• **10 November 1921:** This date marked the first formal commemoration of the birthday of the Marine Corps as 10 November. On 21 October 1921, Maj Edwin McClellan, OIC of the Historical Section, HQMC, sent a memo to MajGen Commandant John A. Lejeune, suggesting that the original birthday of 10 November 1775 be declared a Marine Corps holiday to be celebrated throughout the Corps. Accordingly, on 1 Nov 1921, Gen Lejeune issued Marine Corps Order No. 47 summarizing the history, mission, and tradition of the Corps, and directed that it be read to every command each 10 November.

• **13 November 1982:** The Vietnam Veterans Memorial, containing the names of more than 13,000 Marines who lost their lives in Vietnam, was dedicated this date at the Memorial site in Washington, D.C. The dedication and parade that preceded it were part of a week-long National Salute to Vietnam Veterans.

• **17 November 1918:** The 4th Marine Brigade, as part of the 2d Division, American Expeditionary Force, began its march to the Rhine River, passing through Belgium and Luxembourg, as part of the American forces occupying a defeated Germany.

• **20 November 1943:** The 2d Marine Division, commanded by Major General Julian C. Smith, landed on Betio Island, Tarawa Atoll, Gilbert Islands. After seventy-six hours of bitter fighting during which almost 1,000 Marines died, and more than 2,000 were wounded. MajGen Smith declared the island secure.

• **24 November 1992:** Marines lowered the flag at Subic Bay, U.S. Naval Facility, Republic of the Philippines, for the last time during ceremonies to turn over the facility to the government of the Philippines. The withdrawal ended almost a century of U.S. presence in that nation.

• **25 November 1968:** The conclusion of Operation Lancaster II ended 10 months of action against the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese Army troops in the west-central sector of the demilitarized zone region. Over 1,800 enemy were killed, 42 captured, and 913 weapons seized during the operation.

• 27 November 1950: In a carefully planned assault, eight Chinese Communist divisions in Korea launched a massive attack which had as its expressed purpose, the destruction of the 1st Marine Division. This action led to the successful southward Marine Corps attack out of the Changjin (Chosin) Reservoir to the coastal port of Hungnam.


MISSION ACCOMPLISHED

Hurricane Harvey Recovery Update. Thanks to the Efforts of Marines Tom Miller and Steve Oeding, Here are Results

Tom:

I wish I could have sent this sooner. Your detachment's generous donations has touched 23 verifiable Marines including a Marine's widow and an FMF Corpsman with a \$500 Master Card or Visa gift card.

Since receiving this money, McLemore has helped Marines from Orange, TX (on the Louisiana boarder) south to Corpus Christi. To bring you up to date, Texas Gulf Coast has completed phase one 'rescue' which was what you saw on the news, and phase two 'recovery' which is the need for food, water, diapers and basic necessities plus removing everything from the flooded homes that was contaminated with the flood waters. We have now moved into phase three 'rebuilding' and that is going to take time. To move back into their homes, these Marines need to install insulation and sheetrock so they can have a livable environment. Once they are able to move back into their homes we enter phase four "refurbishing" which means they need heating and air conditioning, kitchen appliances, laundry appliances, beds and furniture. They will also need some basics; clothing, shoes, dishes, pot, pan, towels, sheets, etc. It is our intention to use moneys not spent to work with a local Veteran friendly furniture store to buy discounted certificates so these Marines can purchase these at a reasonable price.

Here are some back stories that I thought you might find interesting.

The first call for help was from an 86 year old Korean War Marine who lived just north of Corpus Christi. His mobile home was flooded. The rescuers picked up him and his wife. They took his wife to a Dallas facility as she has dementia. He showed up at another Marine Corps League member's home with a grocery bag of his belongings asking for help. This Marine took him in and started making calls. Those calls got them in touch with the Texas Veterans Commission and McLemore Detachment. Texas Veterans Commission got this Marine into an apartment and we sent him a gift card so he could replace his necessities.

Not everyone needed money. I received a call from the 1stSgt Joyce Venable Detachment Commandant in Beaumont. They were helping people pull out their wet carpet and sheetrock but did not have enough carpet knives. He felt they needed about 15 to 18 of them. One of our members went a Lowes and bought the last five box cutters they had plus couple boxes of blades. I went to a Home Depot and bought their last 11 box cutters plus extra boxes of blades. I took them 90 miles to Beaumont so they could keep helping Marines and neighbors.

A 93 year old WWII Marine was flooded in Orange, TX. He said he and his companion went to bed with water in the street. She woke up in the middle of the night and found they had a foot of water in their home. They sat on the kitchen table from 3am until they were rescued at 10am. His home had the furniture, sheetrock and carpeting pulled out and sitting in a pile on the street. He said this is not problem. I'll have this house fixed up in six months. He went on to tell me how he was in Okinawa driving a Jeep on a mountain road. Hit a land mine and it went off under the rear of the Jeep. He was lucky that he was able to keep the Jeep on the road and not go over the side. He couldn't hear for a few days but otherwise alright. So in comparison, this was manageable.

Then there are the two Women Marines. The first has three children and was buying her home. After the flood, her insurance company said they were going to pay off her loan and bulldoze the house. She and her children had to move into an apartment. And the second lived in a townhouse near the San Jacinto River that they talk about in the video below. She watched as her neighbors townhomes fall one-by-one into the river as it kept rising. It crested as her home started falling and is now leaning at about a 45 degree angle. This was her retirement home. She now lives with her daughter until she figures out what she is going to do. These women will be the among first Marines we provide additional funds to if we have the funds and we stop receiving requests for additional aid.

Everyone of them tell me how helpful this is and are thankful for the aid. So thank you for your kindness. I hope McLemore has put your money to good work as you would want.

NOTE: FYI we sent \$4,000 to Texas & \$5,000 to Florida, our separate aid checks just arrived recently in Florida to the Dept Commandant (see above) for distribution to Marines in need. Marine Tom Miller completed this mission.
